



T.S.Eliot's poem 'The Wasteland' opens with the lines...

"April is the cruellest month, breeding

Lilacs out of the dead land....."

I don't pretend to understand his poem (which goes on for ages with some very bizarre and disjointed imagery) but what I do know is that April is a rather lovely month. For a start it means spring has arrived, we start to get some colour on the trees, the nights get lighter, the temperature warmer and thoughts of warm days and evening in the garden start to flit through my mind. I hate the cold and this year it seems to have been very cold. I was told when I arrived in Redcar that the weather was usually cold for ten months of the year and worse the other two, but it is around April that I try my best to instil some optimism that perhaps this year we'll actually get a summer.

Perhaps 'hope' is a better word than optimism, optimism is often misplaced but hope with God is sure. It seems when we turn the news on nowadays hope is in short supply with prices always rising and other economic woes. But we've got some great things to look forward to here at St Peters over Holy Week and Easter and indeed more plans for May and beyond (watch out for coming new initiatives).

Hebrews says in chapter 11, 'Now faith is confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see. So for me April isn't cruel, it isn't a time for backward glances of happier times but a time of hope and expectation for the future, and wondering what God might have in store for us in St Peter's, Redcar.



Don't Be Fooled, It's April!

Unbelievable, Holy Week only a week away now, and then Easter, amazing!

Lent nearly over, coming round the last bend and we can see the finish line away in the distance, but we can see it.

How has it been for you? Did you give something up? Did you take something on?

I am sure you have spent a deal of time in prayer at church and at home. You may not have been able to get to Church due to life getting in the way, so prayer at home is even more important, if it ever can be more important than it

Luckily, we have Compline on 'Zoom', where you can join with others on a Sunday evening via the internet. You can see and hear your brothers and sisters at prayer and be part of it yourself.

We need to feel that connection to be a church. It is what the church is after all. Not a building, no, that is only a place for God's people to meet, they are the church.

A big THANK YOU for your prayers and monetary support for the TEESSIDE HOSPICE MIDNIGHT WALK which raised, in total, over £93,000.








Our brave winter gardeners have been working in the cemetery when the weather allows. They have been working on the long border in the middle section. At the


