



Well, we did it! We have actually resumed public worship in our church building. Since writing last month we have held four Wednesday services at 9.30am and on the 2nd of August we invited Rev Rachel to join Curate Tina in welcoming us back.

To mark the occasion they wore a little bit of celebratory bling on their heads! A circlet of flashing lights, which isn't very obvious in the pictures unless you zoom in. I hope the pictures give you an opportunity to see how the social distancing is working. It is still very new, and different but amazingly reverent and special. Do write in to us or post on the facebook page your experience of 'returning' or not!

It isn't for everyone yet and that is why we will continue with the online service on a Sunday evening and we are considering how we might use some of the skills of streaming videos which we have used during lockdown, to continue our links. We are exploring how we can offer more opportunity for Individual prayer again and looking forward to our first Baptism; what a joyous time that will be! The congregation MUST now wear face coverings in church unless there is an exception in their circumstances. If in any doubt about whether you 'can come' (for example children are allowed, but there are rules). We offer a little sheet of GUIDANCE information to those arriving for the first time , which we hope helps.

Whether in the building or at home please remember we haven't forgotten you! Keep in touch as best you can; and as the candles are lit in the Sanctuary (usually before the service commences]) why not JOIN US by lighting a candle at home on

either Wednesday or Sunday or BOTH.

#### **CURATE'S CORNER**



Have you ever had the experience of being lost? When I was a about 5 or 6 years old I was on holiday on the South coast, and my mum and I were in a souvenir shop

looking to find something which we could buy to take home as a reminder of our stay. I must have wandered out of the shop, thinking I was following my mum, and gone into the shop next door, when in fact my mum hadn't left the first shop. I still remember that sense of panic and disorientation when I realised that she wasn't there...and I didn't know where I was! I can't quite remember how long I was lost for but thank goodness that she was looking for me because I do remember the sweet relief and peace that I felt when my mum grabbed hold of my arm. She, on the other hand, demonstrated her relief by telling me off!


As adults, we can still, at times in our lives, feel lost. Even as Christians, we can go through times and seasons in our lives where we feel disorientated. We have a sense of not knowing what we are doing with our lives or where we are headed. And at times like these, a low-level panic can set in – commonly called anxiety. You can't pin it down...you just know that you feel 'lost'. Have you ever been through times like that? I have.

This morning I was much encouraged by my daily devotion which reminded me of what to do and where to turn when you may be feeling lost. Proverbs 3:6 says, "Seek His will in all you do, and he will show you which path to take." The reading said that to have the right attitude in life, we need to 'stay in touch with the control tower'. In the way that Air Traffic controllers see the big picture when it comes to what's going on in the sky, similarly, we need to stay in touch with God – the one who sees the big picture for your life and orchestrates everything that involves you.

Staying in communication with God should be at the top of our daily to-do list. He helps us navigate the ups and downs of life and find our way through those cloudy days when we can't see the next step we need to take. All we need to do is stay in touch, to seek his will, to trust that he is in control and will show us the way. As the perfect parent, God doesn't tell us off when we are lost but brings us back to himself when we call out to him. He is always there. He is always looking for us. He is only a prayer away.

While sharing news about using Zoom, let me tell you about what the evening group (the EMUs!) have been doing.

We started a 'facebook group' on the 5th March so we could plan a secret 'baby shower' type party on the 18th March [our monthly meeting on the 3rd Wednesday of the

month]. However, on Monday the 16th we had to cancel it at very short notice because of the Lockdown. We were all extremely sad but at that time we honestly thought we might get it reorganised before baby was due at the beginning of May! Who were we kidding!! NOT A CHANCE!

It is hard to recall that we never actually celebrated Mothering Sunday as a church family; we sorely missed our special days throughout Holy Week (especially those with young families who would have got together on Maunday Thursday and a Mini Messy church on Good Friday) and the usual build up to Easter Sunday but we did other things together and as members of St. Peter's.....

We lit our Candles of Hope, and made individual Easter Gardens in our own garden or yard; we decorated eggs and made Easter wreaths; and we shared what we were doing for VE Day. 




