

### Vicar's Letter



Writing the vicar's letter for a church magazine can be quite challenging because it is not just addressing the church congregation, because the readership is much wider than that. The subject matter therefore cannot simply be 'in house'

stuff but of a much broader content that will hopefully interest and inform the reader. This month's letter is even more challenging, but for a different reason. It is my last as vicar of St Peters Church Redcar, due to my retirement on 30th June. Usually when leaving a position, it is to take up a new post with all the expectations that brings, but to retire, well, this feels quite different.

I am naturally reflecting on my eight years at St Peters, but I am also looking back over my working life since leaving school aged sixteen. I took ten years out when the children were young, simply doing intermittent supply work, but otherwise have been employed for fifty-one years, and that is a long time. And when many of my friends were beginning to drop their working weeks to four days, I answered a call from God to serve his church as an ordained minister.

Since beginning theological training, twenty-two years ago, I can honestly say I have never regretted one day of what has come my way. God has fulfilled his promise to me in so many ways

'Do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand.'
Isaiah 41:10.

Of course there have been difficult days, on occasions, it must be said, difficult people, and there have been days when I have been so tired, I haven't known how to stand up. But oh, there have been such wonderful days which far outweigh any negatives.

And to all of you, whether regular worshippers, or those who like to stay in touch with St Peter's by magazine or are simply dipping in, thank you. Thank you being a part of those wonderful days and for allowing me to be a part of St Peter's. Vicars come and go but the congregation and parish remain and are the church in this place. The lockdown, due to Coronavirus, has proved that the church is not a building, but is a group made up of faithful loving people, who although they want to meet together in a place set aside for worship and prayer, exist outside of it. And that church is, all of you, held together under God's banner of love. And you will continue to be that church into the future.

My time amongst you as vicar has come to an end, but we know that the love of our heavenly Father never ends, and in that love we trust.


#### **WORSHIP AT ST. PETER'S**

Hello Everyone!

We hope you are enjoying the further relaxation in restrictions and that those who have visited St. Peter's for Private Prayer over the past few weeks have been comforted.

After prayerful consideration of how to move forwards, we have decided we will NOT be



returning to our regular pattern of worship straight away but during July and August we will be having a mix of services available, which will include the online Sunday morning worship #10@10 at 10.00am via Facebook, and Sunday Evening Night Prayer (Compline) at 8.00pm via Zoom, alongside transitioning back into the church building.

To assist this change, as of next week (beginning Monday 13th July 2020) private prayer will no longer be available in order to make a return to services possible, taking into account the practicalities of cleaning.

However, we are pleased to let you know that from **Wednesday 15th July our weekly Holy Communion Service will resume at 9.30am** with continued and
additional safety measures in place, e.g. we will have to keep a register of attendees
to comply with the NHS "Track and Trace" system.






















### **LOCKDOWN ACTIVITY**

Lockdown Learning...

We've been in lockdown since the 23rd March. Did any of us ever think we would still be there at this point in

the year? I wonder what your experience of lockdown has been? I wonder how it has impacted and changed your life? I wonder if your usual routines have changed completely, or not very much? I wonder whether you have loved it...or loathed it? I've heard and read a lot of comment about the lockdown experience and I've had to be careful not to let much of it load unrealistic expectations on myself of how I 'should' be being able to handle the experience. I say, 'myself', because of course, Lockdown has felt different for each of us and has impacted us all in very different

One of the things which I kept hearing though, was that this was a time to cherish – a time to let all the usual demands and enjoyments of our lives fall away and to utilise this gift of time to draw closer to God...to be strengthened in God. While this is a wonderful and laudable encouragement, it has not been as easy as it sounds.

Amidst the reality of the crisis, I had forgotten that drawing closer to God requires a willingness to let God inhabit more of my space – internally and externally. Giving God more time, meant giving him more of me; more listening instead of talking, more being still instead of being distracted, more honesty instead of pretending. And seeking God always involves the putting down or letting go of the emotional 'baggage' we carry around with us, through our daily journey. The things which lay just underneath the surface in us which we know we should really pray about but often ignore.

Taking time with God and admitting to what we are feeling and thinking always brings the relief of knowing that he has heard us...and that Jesus shoulders our burdens for us. This kind of honesty with ourselves, and with God in prayer is the pathway to knowing His deep peace and acceptance within. Only then, when we are resting in his love, do we have the emotional resources to face what's going on around us.


What have we been carrying around in our emotional suitcases through this lockdown journey? Fear? Anxiety? Anger? Frustration? Disappointment? Sadness? Loss? Grief? Helplessness?

Jesus says, 'Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls." Matthew 11: 28-29

My prayer is that as we give more of ourselves to him, we will find so much more of himself given to us in return and that we will continue through these trying times, not with fear or uncertainty but strengthened and encouraged with the knowledge of his love and presence with us, each day.

## A Warm, though Distanced, Welcome for the New Archdeacon of Cleveland

The new Archdeacon of Cleveland, Revd Amanda Bloor, was formally collated into her new role in a private spatially distanced ceremony outside the home of the Bishop of Whitby on the 15th June 2020.

Normally the collation would take place during a public service of thanksgiving and dedication at a church within the



Archdeaconry of Cleveland (the Church of England in South Teesside, the North York Moors, and the Vales of Mowbray and Pickering), but this is impossible due to measures taken in response to the Coronavirus outbreak.

Previously Vicar of Bembridge on the Isle of Wight, Amanda was appointed to the role of Archdeacon of Cleveland in March, in succession to the Venerable Sam Rushton who has moved to the post of Archdeacon of York. The Archdeacon of Cleveland works closely with the Bishop of Whitby in overseeing the outreach, mission and worship of approximately 150 parishes, and undertakes a great deal of administrative and legal work to support them in their work and mission.

During her collation ceremony, the new Archdeacon swore oaths of obedience to The Queen and the Archbishop of York, and received a legal Deed of Collation within sight and earshot of the Bishop of Whitby, the Rt Revd Paul Ferguson; each collected formal documents from the other in a procedure approved by the legal officers of the Diocese of York.

This is believed to be the first time the Church of England has managed such an event in this way. Shortly after the ceremony the new Archdeacon returned home and joined a meeting of church leaders by online video link.

Amanda Bloor said, "I've been so looking forward to getting to work, and to begin learning about the people and places of Cleveland and Middlesbrough. It's been a very long three months and at times it's been hard to believe we would overcome all the obstacles and actually get here at all – but God is good, and thanks to Bishop Paul and those working with him, we have found a way."

Bishop Paul Ferguson said, "Welcoming Amanda has been a wonderfully happy and prayerful moment, and a great relief that she can join us and get to work in supporting the extraordinary work being done during the COVID-19 outbreak by all our churches in their communities, and of course looking to the future when the current restrictions are lifted. This was a strange way to greet Amanda and Mark, but I thank God they are finally here and look forward to their presence among us in the coming years."

### Yes, and I will continue to rejoice (Phil.1:18b)- Term 3

When I last wrote of my training at Cranmer Hall, I was preparing to return for Term 2. So much has happened in our lives and world since then so here I am having just completed the first year of training at the end of a virtual Term 3.

University life closed in quickly ahead of the nationwide lockdown and I found myself in online lectures, Zoom meetings, virtual morning prayer, YouTube worship and with a dissertation and several essays to complete. After Easter, term returned for 6 weeks, which have concluded this week with a Leavers' service for those heading to curacy in some form and a virtual summer party.

During this time, I have sought to appreciate with thankfulness the blessings whilst recognising the ups and downs it has brought me personally.

Thankful that I am living in a place of beauty, able to rest in the presence of our creator God, sharing in the sounds of birdsong and searching for a glimpse of the otters and kingfisher on my Durham river walks.




