



Reader's Ramblings—A Reflection for June by Chris Bowers



I came across the above picture while looking at some training courses and was immediately struck by it. Such a big book for a little person I thought, and it looks like THE BOOK has seen better days as well. Looking at where this young person is reading. It looks around halfway through The Bible so maybe The Book of Psalms. Psalm 131 tells us about how King David has calmed his soul, like a child with his mum. Now I know this picture has been put together but it really speaks, this youngster safe in bed with The Good Book, cared for and nurtured.

There has been a huge amount of talk over the years whether or not we can speak about our God as Father or Mother or both. Well why not, surely we have all heard of fathers who have raised their children as a one parent family. They have to be both father and mother. And I am sure we know of mothers who have had to raise their children likewise. My mum for one after the death of my dad.

All the way through The Bible we have the story of God's relationship with us, from the very act of our creation to the giving of Himself for us, to the wonders of the Acts right up to today's witnesses, to you.

With a calm soul life's troubles and traumas are, not made easy but more manageable. The bit of time before things go wrong is really important, when life is going OK. The young person above needs to understand the Love of God before the world presents itself in all its wonder and all its hardships. A calm soul helps with all those decisions which can go one way or another depending on how we choose.

But there are times when we don't have a choice to make, life takes over and we don't seem able to do anything except just hang on. Hard times when knowing that we are Loved, truly LOVED really matters. Times when we pray and are held in prayer, not helpless but dependent.

It's all in The BOOK.

God works in this world, it's in The Book. His Spirit moves through every fibre of creation, through us and all we can see and all we can't. With a calm soul it helps us to understand this, with the guiding spirit and the word we will come to see it too.

In The New Testament Jesus tells us that, "Let the little children come to me and do not try to stop them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. I tell you the truth, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God like a child will never enter it." (LUKE 18:16-17 for one)

Is this person in the picture young or old, perhaps somewhere in the middle, who knows. We are all God's children so who knows!

You may well have felt like this yourself, dwarfed by the immensity of this Holy Book, this Book which has been given to us, to help us understand the world we live in, the decisions we will have to make while we are here, and to fully understand the amazing fact that we are truly loved when we just have to hang on for the ride.

As for the book in the picture, I was once told that people who read a bible that is falling apart tend to have lives that are rather well held together, what do you think?



Update on the process to appoint a new Priest-in-Charge for Redcar Parish

You will all be aware that we are seeking a new Priest-in-Charge for our Parish and this work is continuing. In April we held interviews; however, we were unsuccessful in appointing on this occasion.

In the first round we were restricted to inviting applications from within the Diocese of York, however we have now been granted permission to seek outside applicants. The selection panel should be unchanged, consisting of the Bishop, Archdeacon, Area Dean and two parish representatives, and this second round should be completed by the end of June.

Please pray for those considering our parish as their new place in which they wish to perform God's work and pray for those involved in the selection process that all are guided by God and blessed with making the right choices according to God's will.

Visiting York and York Minster



I know many of you (like me) enjoy a day out in York, to take in the sights, walk by the river, have a spot of lunch and may enjoy a visit to our Cathedral Church or even to round off an afternoon shopping in the City with Evensong.

No-one needs to 'pay' when we attend there for a service in the Minster. At those times a collection is usually taken (just as in our own church) for the upkeep of the building and the work and ministry of clergy and laity in the parish. Because in reality this 'giving or freewill offering' is quite small by comparison to the huge amount needed for the general upkeep of the building and costs of ministry, like us, they budget and fundraise throughout the whole of the year. They charge visitors to enter at other times of the day.

As a result you may be put off from just popping into the Minster and The Rt Revd Dr Jonathan Frost, Dean of York and the Minster staff wants to welcome each and every one of us to visit whenever we want to! Perhaps to find inspiration for our prayers and discipleship or simply revel in beauty and majesty of the building, built to the glory of God!

This is where the Parish Pass for 2021 will be a great help. It is available digitally (for those who like to use their phone!) or you may simply cut/tear out the page opposite.

Covid has meant a change from previous years, and those planning to visit York Minster now **need to make a reservation in advance**, because the number of people visiting each day is monitored and limited. This may change. However, church members can make a reservation for a specific date and time from the **www.yorkminster.org website** or you may **phone 01904 557275 to make a Parish Pass booking for a specific date and time**.

Parts of the Minster have to be closed from time to time for special events and there are restrictions. You will be asked which church you belong to (possibly which Deanery also) and also have proof of your home address with you!

Bounce Back with Nature

Planting for Mental Health Week 10th-15th May 2021 in Redcar Cemetery



The Friends of Redcar Cemetery were awarded £100 from Redcar Borough Council to spend on plants to mark Mental Health Week. As members of a group that works in this environment, we meet people every week who are coping with loss, and know at

first hand the devastating effects that this has on the individual and the family. We chose to plant along the peace path in the new section of the cemetery. It is a well used path as it leads to a lot of newly formed graves.

The path has seven picture boards including quotations of peace.


We purchased the plants at Longbeck Nursery, Marske; these included two roses, one white and one peach, both with a lovely perfume. The perfume of roses is known to help alleviate depression. Lavender is said to lower the heart rate and blood pressure, which helps relaxation. We also chose small golden green grasses and large blue grasses; green suggests harmony and blue is a highly peaceful colour. The sounds of grasses produce a powerful sense of calm. Other plants chosen were phlox, lupins, pinks, salvia, campanulas, heuchera, and saponaria. We had a beautiful morning to plant and the photo is of some of the planting team. Thanks to Janet Topham of Redcar Borough Council for organising the money which gives the Friends a chance to improve the area for people who are struggling with depression and anxiety due to loss.


This says it all about the positive impact that a garden, gardening and being in an outdoor environment can have in eliminating negative energy.


