From the Churchwardens





Spring is here and how wonderful it is to see lambs in the fields, daffodils in the hedgerows and cherry blossoms filling the trees. God's creation is truly wonderful and with each season our world changes and transforms in such a wondrous way. It is amazing!

As our Parish life progresses to open and we work through the 'Road Map' out of Covid it gives us a chance to reunite with friends, to share fellowship and to come together in worship. Many people are working so hard to bring us out of lockdown and back into church. Anne and I thank you all for the commitment, dedication and hard work, without you this would not be possible. It is lovely to welcome our visiting clergy who preside at our communion services, and it is wonderful to share worship with you all. We are grateful that through this support we can hold communion services on Sundays and Wednesdays, take funerals and we are working on plans to re-commence baptisms.

Our group leaders are meeting and discussing how we might safely restart groups and as these become possible we will keep everyone informed.

We have worked through a selection process to seek our new Priest in Charge; however, we were unsuccessful in making an appointment during this first round. We are seeking to cast the net beyond our own dioceses and are discussing how we may achieve this, in the sure knowledge that God is with us as we come together in his work.

Our work on the church building continues, as you will know the roof replacements are now complete. Our next phase is to undertake repairs to our windows and stone work prioritising the east and north aspects. We are also working on lowering the raised flooring in front of the altar rail to give single level accessibility throughout the main body of the church.

Please make a note in your diaries of the APCM on the evening of Wednesday, 19th May. The PCC has agreed that in compliance with Government rules and church guidance we will hold this meeting in church so please come to join us. We must enjoy each day and despite challenges, worries and concerns we know that God is with us, each and every minute of each and every day, walking our journey, fulfilling his will. I hold dear guidance I received that reminds me that 'what has been' cannot be changed; it is held in the past , and 'what will be' is for the future, but right now at this very minute, at this very moment, the time is 'now' and that is a gift from God.

Reader's Ramblings—A Reflection for May

I've spent a bit of time over the last few weeks wondering where on earth the time has gone. It only seems like last

week that I started training to be a Reader and joined the congregation of St Peter's in my own right (unlike when I'd been around in 2013 as a novice sister on her branch house experience). And it surely can't be nearly three years ago that I started the teaching degree at Sunderland, can it?

And yet, this time has indeed passed. My time in the Order of the Holy Paraclete is coming to an end, which means my time as a Parish Sister is also ending. Yes, I am going to be moving away, but I hope and pray that this will only be temporary, and not permanent. I would dearly love to be able to return to St Peter's. I wish I didn't feel that I have to go away, but I came as a Sister OHP and feel that it is only appropriate that I take a bit of time away: out of respect for OHP and all the support they have given me, but also to allow myself a chance to adjust to "normal" life (if such a thing exists)!

This thinking about time has had me reflecting on Ecclesiastes 3:1-8:

For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven: a time to be born and a time to die; a time to plant, and a time to pluck up what is planted; a time to kill, and a time to heal; a time to break down, and a time to build up; a time to weep, and a time to laugh; a time to mourn, and a time to dance; a time to throw away stones, and a time to gather stones together; a time to embrace, and a time to refrain from embracing; a time to seek, and a time to lose; a time to keep, and a time to throw away; a time to tear, and a time to sew; a time to keep silence, and a time to speak; a time to love, and a time to hate; a time for war, and a time for peace. (NRSV)

There is a time for everything, and a time for everything to take place in. We will have all, no matter how old or young we are, have discovered in life that there are some things which are only meant to last for a set time. Schooling has its pattern. Work has a pattern. Parenting has a pattern. Being a carer for a relative has a pattern. Everything happens to some great unseen schedule. We laugh and we cry, mourn and dance, we plant and we dig up plants. For now, we are in a time where we must refrain from embracing. And how difficult it is!

And yet this too is for a set time. Yes, our Prime Minister and government have set out the road map for coming out of lockdown, with the big caveat that it can only happen providing everyone is following the guidelines and fewer people are getting poorly. But it's not actually their schedule.

Even the Gospels and Jesus becoming the incarnate word made flesh, living among us, was on a schedule that was completely divine. Studying John's Gospel for the current module of Reader Training we were asked the question about the timing – did God choose the time because the Roman Empire was there and creating the infrastructure that would allow the Gospel Message to be spread via their armies and trade routes? Or did God somehow ordain the Roman Empire so that there would be that infrastructure in place for the Apostles and the Early Church? I thank God that this is a Holy Mystery sort of thing, that us mere humans will never be able to work out the answer to – because again there is a time for having and knowing answers, and a time for only having questions. Ultimately, whatever happens, the timing is only partly because of the circumstances around us. God is at work, unseen but very definitely there, with the Spirit guiding our daily steps as we seek to follow Jesus.

Like everyone else, I'm following Jesus. I've set my hand to the plough, and I'm trying to not look back, to look forward and to trust. My "last" Sunday at St Peter's will be Trinity Sunday, 30th May, and I could not think of a better festival to send us all on our way to the next steps that God has in mind for us.

I thank each and every member of the St Peter's family for being there during this part of my journey, and for the honour of being allowed to walk alongside you in your journeys. May God continue to bless you all richly! Louisa x



NEWS FROM THE FRIENDS OF REDCAR CEMETERY

We are continuing our work in the cemetery which has been helped by some good weather. We are so pleased that we are getting new members, this has been helped by the pandemic as more people are walking in the cemetery and realising the peace and comfort that this special place brings.

Redcar has much history and that can be found in the stories behind the headstones. One such story relates to Ernest Gordon Scott. He was born in 1881 and baptised in Stokesley where his father Henry Scott was a butcher in the west end of the village. He was one of 6 brothers and a sister.

He moved to Redcar and became a blacksmith and farrier and lived in Lord Street. He married Mary Caton in 1911, her father Thomas Ainsworth was a sea captain.

The inscription on the headstone reads 'In loving memory of our dear parents Mary Ann Scott died 15.9.1943 aged 61 years and Ernest Scott died 4.5.1960 aged 79 years. Also Mary Gordon Scott their beloved daughter died 9.5.1976 aged 62 years.' This headstone can be found in section N in the old cemetery. A large tree blew down in a gale a few years ago and the headstone spun out of the grave row. It has since been re set in its rightful place.

During the first World War Ernest, as a farrier, was not in a protected occupation but he was given extra time at home before joining up in May 1916 as his work was vital to help farmers and men who delivered food and fuel by ensuring the health of horses by attending to their feet. Growing food was a top priority in the first World War.

Local history books often feature the memorial town clock at Redcar but little about the weather vane. Ernest made this vane which was secured above the clock in the High Street. If you look closely at the image on the previous page you will see a silhouette which appears on the wall. This is the actual weather vane featuring a sailing ship that stands proudly on top of the clock tower. Ernest was working with his apprentice. The other image is of Ernest and his family with their little dog walking on the Espanade.

Thanks to Joyce, a lady we met at one of our fundraising days in Laburnum Road Library, who gave us the images and information.



Please do pray that housing is sorted, pray that there are welcoming people and most of all pray for my continued trust in the slow work of God as I prepare for ordination and ministry proclaiming the Good News of the gospel and its message of the transforming love of Jesus.




