The last coronation was famously a time when people bought the new fangled TV sets and invited neighbours in to crowded living rooms to watch black and white pictures of the events at Westminster Abbey. Technology is such now that you can watch the coronation on your phone, PC, TV, big screen in town, lap top ...

Whatever way you watch it (if indeed you want to – not everyone does), it's good to join with others in community. We can still invite the neighbours in! And you are always welcome to join us at St Peters at 5.00pm for a faith tea and a bit of fellowship.

Easter continues through May ending on that great day of Pentecost on 28th May.



I love this picture, painted by my friend Yvonne Dean. To me it just shouts PENTECOST! The pure white dove symbolic of the Holy Spirit cutting through the blackness at the birth of the church. Fire seems to be left in its wake, another great symbol of Pentecost and there is a feeling of rushing wind with all the swirls. She has caught the movement of the Spirit, a 'movement' that has spread throughout the world from its beginnings at Pentecost. 2000 years on and the effects of Pentecost are still rippling out across the globe.

When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. ² Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. ³ They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. ⁴ All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them. 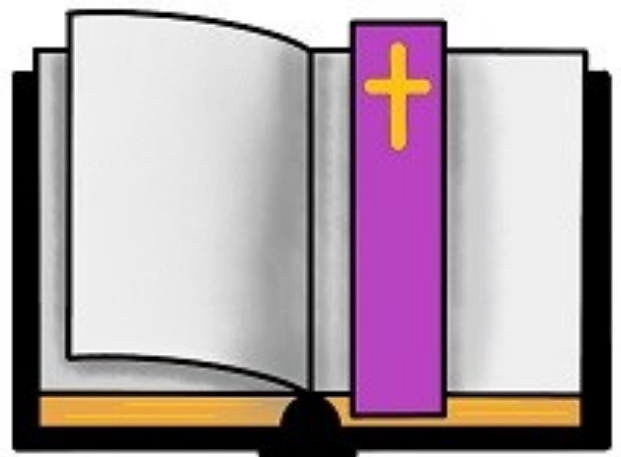

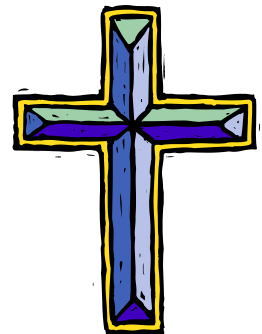

You will have seen a nice red leather sofa appear in the Narthex. I know many of you have already commented on how comfortable it is. We are looking for another one to complement it, but I am trying to support the local charity shops so we have to wait until a suitable one appears.

We are also looking for some lighting to string up above the area where the sofas will be, some softer mood lighting to complement the space, it won't be long before that appears too.

We now have Reflections posters in the main supermarkets; also Julie Tait and her family have very kindly done a leaflet drop in the local area.

I have attended two schools with Rev Andy, and intend to keep that going with a view to getting a leaflet to the parents on what it is all about.

I am also more active in attending our coffee mornings and also any events we hold at church that involve families to help promote our project.

We also have, I am told, a very nice coffee machine. Not being an aficionado of the drink, this is lost on me (I am very much a Yorkshire tea drinker), however, I do sample the coffee on a Wednesday evening, and it is very nice.

Some were roaring away, and were very much an instant success, while some were a bit slower to take off; however, we were all encouraged by the words spoken by Ian McIntosh, who is our Diocesan Director of Ministry and Mission, when he said that we were walking with Jesus on this journey not running. Walking pace is three miles an hour, there is no rush, we need to let God direct us where he wants us to go and at what speed.

So you will see some more changes in the coming weeks in the furniture etc, please don't be put off by this, some things will work and some may not but if we don't try we will never know.

If as you read this someone springs to mind that may be enquiring, asking questions about what life and God is all about, please encourage them to come along; also, please don't be afraid to come along yourself and chaperone them if you feel that is appropriate - no pressure, just a warm inviting space to discuss the issues affecting everybody at the moment.

I hope this update has helped you understand where we are at this moment in time and please feel free to speak to me if you have any ideas that may be relevant.

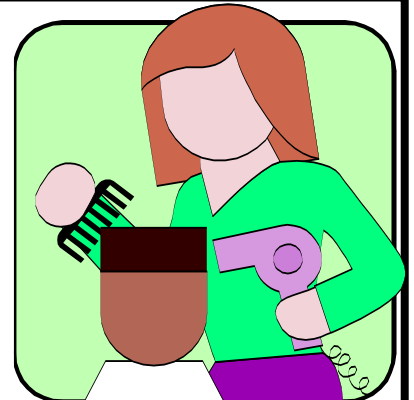
