PENTECOST: GOD'S STORY!

Acts 2

If there is any day in history that you can point to as the beginning of the Christian church, then the day of Pentecost is that day. Which means, I guess, that Pentecost is the Church's

birthday, whoop whoop!

And what a day it was, full of miracle and wonder, strange voices, wrong interpretations and freaky weather conditions. It was already a religious observance, Pentecost, (meaning 50 days – since Passover) the feast of weeks when the first fruits of the barley harvest was brought and offered to God.

But this year it was special, this year's Pentecost had already been written about in ancient text, this year's Pentecost contained a message of liberation and hope to all who heard and responded to the message, thousands did on that day and millions more since. God poured out his Spirit on all people, there were prophesy, visions, dreams, wonders were to be seen and... and that promise 'everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved' WHAT A DAY!

Scroll back a few weeks though – and we see a group of people in an upper room getting the rug pulled from under them. Getting the kick in the stomach that they just weren't expecting. Not hope it seemed but despair.

The man that they had followed, prayed with, healed with, adventured with, hoped in, vested in was telling them that he was leaving them.

Philip seems to have been a very proof orientated guy. Thomas usually gets the blame for doubting, but here it's Philip that opens the conversation about the relationship between Jesus and God the Father.

“Lord, show us the Father and that will be enough for us” In a rather more diplomatic answer Jesus basically says to him, “have you been walking around with your ears and eyes shut for the last three years, believe me when I say that I am in the Father and the Father is in me or at least believe on the evidence of the works themselves”

But then the tone changes, Jesus tells them that he is ‘going to the Father’ he’s leaving them! SO Keep believing, keep seeing, keep asking.

For a moment, try to imagine just how the disciples are feeling at that very moment. He’s mentioned this before, perhaps now it’s sinking in. Confusion? Despair? They don’t really realise as yet, but Jesus is telling them that they are a part of God’s narrative, God’s story that spans the history of this world. Jesus is telling his disciples that he is leaving them, but also that the story is not finished yet. It’s a brilliant fact to hold onto, whenever we are going through those terrible life moments, God promises that our story isn’t over.

I love watching Brian Cox’s series called The Planets. He tells such a great story of how our solar system is thought to have come about. BUT he misses out one massive element in the story – that this is God’s story....

And if we look at God’s story intertwined with our story we see a God of restoration, love. Right from the garden of Eden where Adam and Eve have received all that is good, they still fail, and God has to come looking for them. And we see this pattern time and time again throughout history, this failure of people and a God that moves heaven and earth to come looking.

It’s in the story of Noah, of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, of Jonah, of the exodus and exile of his people. It was how the character and nature of the kings of Israel were defined and the message and life of the prophets. The story is not over yet, God has his plan.

And it's in the stories Jesus told, the lost son, and coin and sheep, the Sower and the seed, the workers in the vineyard, and it was in the things Jesus did, restoring sight, hearing, health, mobility, freedom, LIFE!

And in what he is saying in that upper room, with Judas now gone, and the disciples holding onto every word. He's leaving them but God's story isn't over yet.

If you love me and keep my commands, in other words, if you really want to be carry on being part of this great story, God's story (it's hard being part of God's story when we are going in the opposite direction) the task will seem too great without me but, I am 'giving you another advocate to help and be with you forever – the Spirit of truth.'

And that spirit, the Holy Spirit is in you and me also. The ripples of Pentecost come down the ages so when we decided to follow Jesus, to love him and keep his commands, we too receive the Spirit of truth, we too become part of this great narrative, this great story. And not in a general truth, detached sort of way, but personally. That's what Pentecost was all about, the Spirit living within us whether you're a son or daughter, old or young, servant or master, man or woman. The current narrative of the western world at the minute is about 'diversity' – God's always been into diversity – "I will pour out my Spirit on ALL people" Peter quotes from an ancient text hundreds of years old then, never mind now!

I guess the question is, do you want to be part of God's story. Perhaps you already are. Since Ascension I've been praying for my 5 people, those names we put on this tree. I'm going to continue to pray for them, so that they will become part of God's great story of love and redemption.

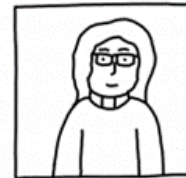

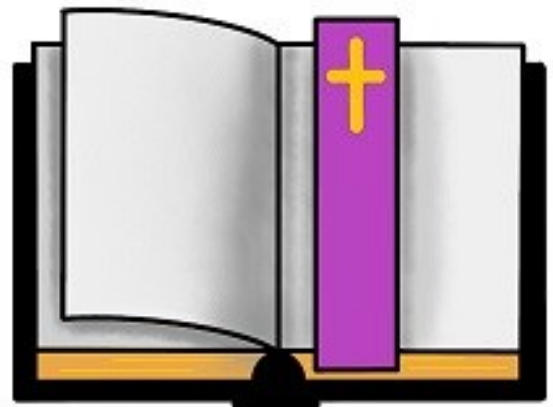

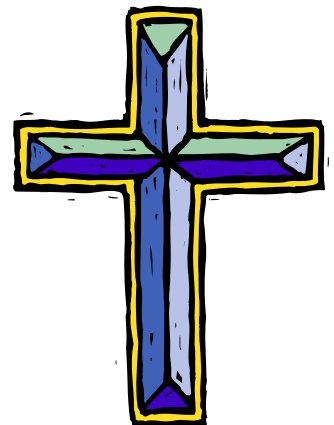

Rev'd Elaine Writes...

While looking for inspiration for something to write for this month's magazine I came upon an article about Liquorice Allsorts. They were my mum's favourite sweets and there were always Liquorice Allsorts in our house.

Liquorice Allsorts have been around since 1899 and the story goes that one day Bassetts sent one of their salesmen, Charlie Thompson, from their factory in Sheffield to Leicester to demonstrate their newly manufactured liquorice sweets to a potential buyer. During the demonstration the salesman accidentally knocked over his box of samples on to the floor in front of the buyer. Seeing all the wonderful, colourful mix of sweets on the floor, the buyer asked Bassetts to produce just such an assortment for him to sell. What this became was the mix of sweets we now know as Liquorice Allsorts.

In the aftermath of Easter the disciples were left a bit like the box of liquorice samples upended on the floor. They were a bit of a 'hotch-potch' of people – fishermen, a tax collector, activists and others who we know little about, each with their own colourful personalities, good and bad traits, each with their complex layers of failures and doubts just like the diverse 'allsorts' in the box. While Jesus had been alive they had stayed in reasonable order because Jesus had made it so (like the box of sample sweets the salesman carried).



But when Jesus was arrested and crucified the disciples were scattered, and although after the Resurrection on Easter Day they regrouped in the upper room for a while, like the liquorice sweets being replaced in their sample box for the journey back to Bassetts, here they were after Jesus' Ascension back to heaven, feeling as if they had been poured out onto the floor all over again in a mess and a mix up. But sometimes from what looks like chaos something wonderful begins. The 'happy accident' of the salesman and his liquorice sweets became the well-loved box of Liquorice Allsorts that is still popular today, over 120 years later.

And the disciples?

Well, they went on to be filled with the Holy Spirit at Pentecost (this year celebrated in St Peter's on 19th May) and started the Christian Church which shared the Good News of Jesus with all the world. The Christian Church is still sharing that Good News now, over 2000 years later and encouraging people, whoever they are, to follow in the way of life that Jesus demonstrated and to share God's love in the world. Just like Jesus called a bunch of 'all sorts' to follow him and to build something wonderful to share God's love, God still calls all sorts of people to be part of the Church today, in their local churches, in villages, in towns and cities all over the world.

Whoever you are, whatever your past holds, whatever you look like, whatever age you are, you are welcome in God's Church because God loves all sorts!

Have a blessed May and don't forget to wear Red to church for Pentecost!
