





READER'S RAMBLING

Good Times

You will be reading this magazine as we approach one of the most important times in our church calendar. We will be shortly moving into the period of Advent, a time full of expectation and hope,

leading to that magical day, the birth of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Before that, however, we have some other feasts or festivals to come and have you ever wondered why these days are celebrated? I know I have, so this rambling gave me an opportunity to delve into the history of them.

At the moment, your hands may be cut and raw from hollowing out pumpkins to be used as lanterns, as a kid we could only use turnips which, those of you of a certain age will remember how difficult it is to hollow out a turnip. This activity is all leading up to Halloween, the 31st October. We will all hear the chatter of excited children walking around the streets with their lanterns shining brightly, unless there is a strong wind blowing, we await the knock on the door or the doorbell ringing to be met with the saying "trick or treat". I hope you all have bowls of sweets to give away just in case a trick ensues. Halloween, or to give it its proper name All Hallows Eve, is a prerequisite to All Hallows Day, commonly known today as All Saints' Day. Wikipedia tells us that "All Saints' Day is a Christian solemnity celebrated in honour of all the saints of the church, whether they are known or unknown. This is celebrated on 1st November".

It may be good to remember that those of us who don't necessarily agree with or like Halloween, can take solace in the fact that it is just a lead into a celebration of all our saint's lives and ultimately their deaths.

Following on from that we have an All Souls' Service where we celebrate the lives of all those faithfully departed. The Christian celebrations of All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day stem from a belief that a powerful spiritual bond exists between those residing in heaven and those still living on earth.

Other faiths celebrate this day; for instance, in Catholic theology, the day is used to commemorate all those who have attained the beatific vision in heaven, the beatific vision is the direct specific communication of God to an individual person. In Methodist theology, All Saints Day centres around "giving God solemn thanks for the lives and deaths of all his saints", including the famous and the lesser known. Paul the Apostle, Augustine of Hippo and John Wesley being the famous, but also included are those who have personally led someone to faith in Jesus, it could be a friend, work mate of family member.

In church you will see the colour of the vestments change from Ordinary Time green to white for All Saints' Day, and then for the remainder of Advent we display purple, signifying the different feast or festival days.

I hope that has helped you understand the significance of this time; good times are just around the corner for all Christians, and I look forward to celebrating them with you all.





Mothers' Union Global Day 2021

For many years now, MU has supported and highlighted **'16 Days for Activism Against Gender –Based Violence'** and the latest released facts and figures produced by the government Office for National Statistics (2019) continue to make very sad reading.

This year Mothers' Union is responding by holding a Global Day 2021 # NoMore1in3. It is centred on the disturbing figure that "1 in 3 women worldwide have experienced domestic or sexual abuse" and that Mothers' Union as a leading women's organisation believe this to be unacceptable.

There have been many stories in the press and across the media platforms of an increase of domestic violence throughout the pandemic period and it's time to say NO MORE!

Take care, stay safe and keep in touch.




A Prayer

Preparing for Christmas 2021 Jesus Shaped People The World of Jesus An eight session 'Zoom' programme on Tuesdays 7.00pm to 9.00pm Tuesday Nov 2nd 2021 to Tuesday Dec 21st 2021

What can we discover about people and places associated with Jesus' ministry? What intriguing historical and geographical features are available? Explore remarkable recent archaeological discoveries, and benefit from additional non-biblical contemporary records.

In eight sessions participants will 'visit' the following:

- 1. Nazareth
- 2. Sea of Galilee
- 3. The Decapolis
- 4. Samaria
- 5. The Jordan Valley
- 6. The Coastal Plain
- 7. Judaea
- 8. Jerusalem.

Each session will include slide presentations, small group discussion and a plenary question time. Additional resources will be made available each week. Gordon Dey will lead, drawing from his extensive pilgrimage experience, and Revd Janice Smith will host the event. No charge will be made, but donations will be invited for a charity in Bethlehem that is supporting poor and destitute families there. 'Christians in Bethlehem' are largely dependent on pilgrimage and tourism, and so they have particularly suffered in the past two years.
