

## The Big Question

If you've ever read the famous book, Hitchhiker's Guide To The Galaxy, you'll know that one of the key strands in the book is the discovery of the point of life, the universe and everything. They find that the answer is ... 42! I think that they go on to wonder just what the question was. It was a long time since I read it.

When it comes to Life, The Universe and Everything we've often got loads of questions ourselves:

Why am I here? Where did I come from?

What's the point of it all? Where am I going?

Is death the end?

Why is there so much trouble and suffering in the world?

Where have I put my car keys? Where's my glasses? What's for dinner?

Jesus was often asked difficult questions, actually if you study them he often answered a question by asking another. People asked him under whose authority he did the things he did, how to get eternal life, who is classed as 'my neighbour', are you the King of the Jews? Are you the Messiah? And what about all those people who got killed in that tower falling disaster?

What question would you ask Jesus if he was stood in front of you right now?

During September and October we will be running a START COURSE on Monday evenings at St Peter's. It's a course for people that want to explore the Christian faith and to ask those hard questions. What's life all about and where are we going? Does God exist and if so what's he like? Why is the world in such a mess? Who is Jesus and why is he relevant? What does Jesus' death on the cross mean for us today? How can I go forward with God in my life?

As well as answering questions, Jesus also posed some very searching questions himself. He once asked his disciples what people were saying about him. "Who do people say I am?" The things people were saying were similar today, 'a prophet' 'a teacher', some people today still believe that Jesus was just a made up character written by some ancient writer despite the evidence to the contrary.

Then Jesus turns the question onto his disciples, I can imagine him looking at them, lingering at each eye contact. "Who do YOU say I am?" and it's Peter, who (with the direction of the Father in heaven) gives the answer. You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God.

It's a question for us all, and if you are not sure of the answer, come along to the Start course at St Peter's, beginning Monday 4th September at 7.30pm for six weeks.

## Holiday Reading

Being in the middle of nowhere with not a lot to do gave me the chance for some recreational reading. I really enjoyed Rev Richard Cole's "Murder Before Evensong", a good murder mystery with Richard's funny and well observed Vicar's view of his congregation.


Another Richard, this time Osman (from Pointless and that other quiz on BBC 2 at tea times), wrote "The Thursday Murder Club". Another murder mystery with religious undertones, set in a converted Catholic Convent that had become senior citizens' sheltered apartments. Brilliant story.

"Shallow Graves in Siberia" by Michael Krupa is an account of a Polish man who had started at Seminary to become a Jesuit Priest but left to join the army at the start of WW2. Captured by the Russians, he was accused of spying and was taken to the Gulags in Siberia. The story is of his escape to Afghanistan hundreds of miles away. He eventually reached freedom, ultimately finding a home in Bradford, near my last parish.

Finally, since we were staying in France, just a few miles from where Richard the Lionheart met his end, I read a brilliant account of his life by another author who happened to be a Vicar, Antony Bridge. It's so interesting to read a book that is largely set in a place where you are.





## Rev'd Elaine writes...

“What is this life if, full of care,  
We have no time to stand and stare.  
No time to stand beneath the boughs  
And stare as long as sheep or cows.  
No time to see, when woods we pass,  
Where squirrels hide their nuts in grass.  
No time to see, in broad daylight,  
Streams full of stars, like skies at night.  
No time to turn at Beauty's glance,  
And watch her feet, how they can dance.  
No time to wait till her mouth can  
Enrich that smile her eyes began.  
A poor life this if, full of care,  
We have no time to stand and stare”.

These words - from the poem “Leisure” by WH Davies - were written over a hundred years ago, yet, despite the massive shifts in technology and culture we still cheat ourselves of time to "stop and stare". I can imagine the poet dreaming of a future time when technology might transform our living, slowing us down offering more leisure, more opportunities to reflect on what it is to be a human or just to be.



Confounding that dream, technology has done the opposite. It has filled our activities even more. We might stop and stare, but we stare at the TV, our laptops our tablets. Children's lives too can be all about packing in so much activity. Dashing to this group, to that club, the next sport activity, with no time offered just to be at peace, quiet, just thinking.

Followers of Jesus are encouraged to stop and stare. Jesus said "And why do you worry and labour? See how the flowers of the field grow. They do not labour or spin. Yet I tell you that not even Solomon in all his splendour was dressed like one of these". Take time, stop and stare.

Our lives are busy, frantic and always on the go and God didn't create us to withstand that constant tsunami of information, technology and communication. God offered us Sabbath - time, not exclusively a Sunday - when we can contemplate and pray deeply about things. To remember that Jesus often went off to 'a certain place' to pray, to reflect and to make space for God and to stop and stare. If Jesus needed to do that then we must follow his example.

So this September make space, take time, grasp the opportunity to just stop and stare and see and listen for what God can offer you, as well as noticing the beautiful coastline and countryside that we are blessed with here in Redcar.

## Reader's Rambling

### Believe

I learned a good lesson earlier on this month about believing and having faith: not necessarily spiritual faith, but just believing in something or someone.

We are currently going through a period in our church calendar where, to be honest, not a lot is going on. You will see the vestments on the alter are green for quite a long time. We did celebrate the Transfiguration of our Lord at the beginning of August, but it can be quite difficult for us to be refreshed in our spiritual belief this month.

You may or may not know that Suzanne and I are heavily involved with the Duke of Edinburgh award scheme for young people and this year we had fifteen young people doing their gold award on the North Yorkshire Moors.

For these young people to pass this particular part of the award, they have to spend four days walking and three nights camping. They have to demonstrate team work, leadership skills, map reading and camp craft. They have to be fully self sufficient meaning that they have to carry all their equipment and all their food for the four days. No mean feat in itself.

We have been involved with their training, but this particular group of six young people were new to us. We took them on a number of practice expeditions to give them a flavour of what to expect. Quite frankly we were horrified at how poor they were, they got lost twice, could not read the map or the signs properly, were not prepared to listen to advice and thought they knew it all.

There was only two weeks left before their qualifying expedition and myself, Suzanne and the other two leaders were prepared to defer their expedition for another year. After all, we did not want to have to chase them all over the moors for four days putting them right; Duke of Edinburgh Award participants should be competent enough to complete the expedition themselves.

You can imagine our faith in their abilities was somewhere below zero. When Suzanne and I returned from a week away in the caravan, I fully expected a call to say the expedition was off, but it was not. So we turned up on day one, very worried that this was going to be a really hard weekend. The weather on day one was atrocious, heavy rain and low lying fog.

Here we go, I thought. It was at this time when I remembered Ali, the pastor at my brother's church, saying to me, "Sometimes Steve, you have to just believe. Believe that what you have done will come good; believe in the Lord and He will provide".

I have to tell you that that group of young people were outstanding over the whole expedition; they never put a foot wrong; they were on time and did not get lost, they were a joy to work with and they passed with flying colours.

It just goes to show, that sometimes you just have to put aside your doubts and believe. I believe that it's the same with our faith; when you have doubts or when not a lot is going on, fall back on your faith and remind yourself to believe in God and He will provide. Lesson learned!

Our guest speaker this time will be from The Hydrogen Village trials to tell us all about this controversial project.


As usual there will be also reports from Redcar East local police officers, whereby we can also feed back any policing concerns we may have.

### **But God says...**


You are a beautiful human being.

## NEWS FROM THE FRIENDS OF REDCAR CEMETERY

This month we are concentrating on improving the plot map, which is the notice board on Thwaites Lane, the lane leading to the Bowling Club. The map on the board

identifies all the burial and cremation plots in all three sections of the cemetery.



Many people now want to trace their family tree and come to the cemetery to look for family members. Some people who search may not have been to the cemetery for years and have forgotten where

their family and friends are buried. There have been many changes in the cemetery over the last few years and these need to be reflected on the board to give people an idea of where they are. The memorial wall, sanctums and the Peter Rabbit Garden need to be added to the board.

Years ago if you wanted this information you would go to the office which was the building on the right-hand side through the gates in the old section. The cemetery manager would help you with that. Later you had to contact the council offices, however, now you have to contact 'Deceased online' for the information. They will give you the number of the area in the cemetery; the row number that the grave is in and grave number on that row which corresponds with the board. Once the person has that number, we are able to help them find the grave.

Work continues in the cemetery including our planting of 18 new lavenders. They are a mixture of three varieties, Essence Purple, Munstead, and Angustifolia. In the future it will be a lovely walk down the path in the middle section.

‘Lavenders in the garden are said to be a gentle reminder to slow down and embrace the beauty of life’ (Hans Christian Anderson.)

The lavender at the Tulip Tree has been cut by Jane and Kath, and Christine has made some lavender bags, which we are selling to help with our fundraising.

Thanks to them. A tip to store dried lavender is to put it in an airtight container and store in a cool dry place away from light and heat. This will preserve the fragrance and the colour and prevent mould. Smell, enjoy and relax.




